Welcome & Approval of January minutes

- January minutes approved
- It was mentioned that the Study Abroad Conference on May 9th is the same as Summer Orientation date which will make it difficult for many advisors to attend.
- Advisor Conference was a record attendance; Charlie Nutt was a great speaker

Diversity class overview/Enrollment trends

Dr. Mary Wagner

- USC is 10th fastest growing flagship campus in the nation in enrollment
- Prior to 2009 we had more instate students than out of state students
- In 2018 we had 10514 in state applications
- More college age students living in the other 49 states than in SC
- Fall 2018 enrollment 2838 in state and 3036 out of state for the freshmen class
- We are growing while getting better SAT 1276
- Improving ACT score and more admits are taking the ACT
- Students are submitting about 7 or more college applications and weighing the packages they are going to receive to decide where to attend
- Fall 2018 bought 363965 names of potential high school students and start communicating with them as far out as 36 months before graduation; out of those enrolled 5848
- Fall 2018 class diversity 80% white, 19% URM (underrepresented minority) (2 or more races represented), 1% unknown, 0% non-resident, alien
- Most of our diversity comes from in state
- Our incoming populations is broken into -- 70% freshmen, 18% transfer, 4% change of campus
- USC system has 6347 African American students enrolled
- USC has more African American students than the private HBC colleges. SC State is the only public HBC that has more African American students than us and that is 87 students.

- On the horizon, the SAT score has changed.
- In 2016 27 ACT equated to a 1200 SAT now it is closer to a 1280 SAT
- Criteria for Life/Palmetto Fellows are going to be changing due to the test score plus the grading scale changing from a 7-point scale to a 10-point scale.
- High school graduates from 2001-2034 will have -5% decline
- SC high school rate is going down then applications will decline bay -2%
- 2018-2026 there should be an increase of 8% growth in students
- 2026-2032 there should be a decrease of 8% decline in students
- Benchmark SATE 480 EBRW 530 MATH only 45% of SC student meet both and only 16% African American Student meet both.
- National 4-year graduation rates for Associate Degrees is at 35% but USC graduation rate is 70%. We graduate more than the Associate degree granting schools.
- Fall 2017 our class looked 20065 URM, 45% took SAT; 1033 URM enrolled in USC-Columbia (40%); 1933 URM enrolled at the 4year USC Campuses
- Good book to read especially for falling asleep but explains this *Demographics and the Demand for Higher Education* by Nathan D. Growe
- Future we need to be agile, emphasis retention, internal recruitment, time to degree, and diversity
- We need to find new measures of success; affordability; outcomes need to be emphasized more than imputes
- For the fall 2019 class, the number 4 major is Undecided.
